



Howe Sound Secondary School – Outdoor Leadership Program Student Application

What is the Outdoor Leadership Program?

The Howe Sound Outdoor Leadership Program is in its second year of development. Previously, the program ran for a number of years at Don Ross, and the program has since shifted to Howe Sound. The program will offer courses in winter and summer outdoor skills and various community projects. An emphasis on the development of leadership and cooperative skills through outdoor activities will be balanced with assignments based on outdoor-related issues and themes. Total credits for students will be 8, with four Physical Education 11 or 12, and four for Outdoor Leadership 11 or 12.

Currently, the course may include skill development in teambuilding challenges and initiatives, outdoor safety, introductory wilderness first aid, nordic skiing, backcountry skiing and/or riding, day hiking, backpacking, route finding with compass and GPS, climbing, flatwater canoeing, kayaking, sea kayaking, and overnight camping using industry standards as a guideline for course development and instruction. Course fees and fundraising will cover costs for outdoor recreation activities, including leadership and instruction. Some students may wish, based on their experiences, to certify in areas of interest to them.

When will it be offered?

In fall semester, students will take the Outdoor Leadership course during their regular timetable. In addition students will also take part in the yearlong Outdoor Leadership Physical Education course.

Where will it be offered?

At Howe Sound Secondary School and the surrounding environment. One half of the course will be taught in a classroom setting and in the areas surrounding the school, with the rest taking place in the outdoors on various trips.

What will it cost?

Course fees for the year will be \$550. Additional fund-raising by course participants will be used to augment fees for course activities. Course fees are due no later than June 15th, 2013.

Are there any prerequisites?

Participants need to have completed the 2012-2013 school year with 'G' or 'E' work habits in all of their courses.

Who should apply?

Successful applicants should be prepared to spend considerable time in a coastal, moist winter/spring environment. An interest in outdoor activities and participation in group activities is essential, but one need not be an accomplished outdoorsperson. Applicants could be as varied as individuals interested in becoming certified mountain or backpacking guides or sea kayaking guides to people interested in a career in journalism that might include writing copy for tourism promotion or articles for outdoors magazines. Applicants should also have a strong record of academic success and an established history representing an ability to work hard to meet course objectives.

How should one apply?

Complete the full application on the attached form, complete and attach your written paragraph, secure a signature from your parent or guardian, another from your teacher reference, and submit the package to Mr. Harwood by Monday, May 13, 2013. Successful applicants will be given a high-risk waiver forms and must submit tuition fees by June 15th to be entered into the class.
